

How to use Transparator

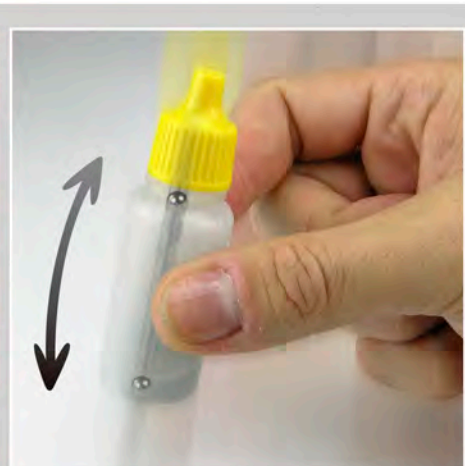

In this Step by Step file we want to present an innovative new product, introducing the Transparator A.MIG-2016. A product developed to make any AMMO acrylic color into a versatile transparent color.

In this step by step we are showing how to use Transparator in a simple way, creating shadows and panels on aircraft.



- 1 We apply a layer of Grey Primer A.MIG-2002, lightly thinned with Acrylic Thinner A.MIG-2000.
- 2 Now we airbrush panels with Dark Grey A.MIG-908. To get a thin line, we lower the air pressure of the airbrush and we remove the nozzle.
- 3 We mask half the aircraft with tape and then we are checking how well our acrylic color is covering the surface without Transparator, applying the color A.MIG-208.



- 4 Now we are creating the color mixture with Transparator. We use a ratio of 60% paint and 40% Transparator. To get an optimum mixture we add a steel paint mixer A.MIG-8003.

5 Now we can see what happens when we apply our base color mixed with Transparator. The base color is transparent, allowing for our panel lines to be defined.

Although we have applied many layers, A.MIG-2016 Transparator ensures that the paint will not flood the surface.
